Become a Member - Professional memberships are important, but most importantly, judges are covered by liability insurance when we contract through NAWGJ and judge under a meet sanction.

National Association of Womens' Gymnastics Judges - Join Us \$30 first year; \$60 renew annually.

2) USAG

Become a Member • USA Gymnastics - \$99, renew yearly.

USA Gymnastics | Professional Background Check- \$30, renew every 2 years.

USA Gymnastics | U110: U.S. Center for SafeSport Core Course – Free, renew yearly.

Ask your State Judging Director about practice judging requirements for your state.

Dress professionally in a white shirt and navy slacks or skirt. Purchase the official NAWGJ uniform for your SECOND year and beyond of judging. WEAR YOUR UNIFORM WHEN YOU PRACTICE JUDGE.
 Save your Receipts:
Keep track of your income from judging and save your receipts for judging expenses such as memberships, uniform, books, clinics etc. You are responsible for tracking these for federal and state (if applicable) income taxes.

Judging Timeline

First year judges are often <u>not</u> yet eligible to judge until after meet assignments have been made for the season.

Be prepared and get ready to judge. Meets may still need judges or substitutes. Looking forward to judging with you!
